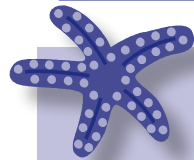

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

We truly understand what it takes to care for our community, because they are our family, friends and neighbors. To save lives, give hope and bring comfort to our patients and their families is not just our job; it is our purpose.

COMMITMENT

The act of volunteering means commitment to a definite program. As a Volunteer, you will be expected to work a minimum of 4 hours per week. The Adult Program Volunteer (ages 18 and above) make a 6-month commitment (100 hours). The Junior Program (ages 15 – 18) makes a 4-month commitment (60 hours).

WHAT IS THE FIRST STEP?

Complete the enclosed Volunteer Application.

(If the application is missing, Call 520-469-8537 or stop by the NMC Volunteer Office to request a Volunteer Application.)

After receipt of your application materials, you will be contacted for an interview.

You will need to bring the following additional information to the interview:

- A photo ID and your social security number
- Two references from non-family members attesting to your suitability to be a hospital volunteer
- A copy of your immunization record, if available.

All volunteers will be drug tested.

Adult volunteers will have a background check.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Messenger* - Adult and Jr. Position

- Transports non-critical patients via wheelchair
- Errands inside the campus

Book Cart* - Adult and Jr. Position

- Offer patients and visitors books or magazines.

ICU Liaison* - Adult Position

- Works as a liaison for ICU patients' family members and staff

Information Desks* - Adult and Jr. Position

- Resource for Visitors and Patients regarding locations of patients and services on campus
- Flower and newspaper deliveries
- Some positions require minimal computer skills

Clerical - Adult and Jr. Position

- Clerical duties filing, typing and general receptionist duties

Gift Shop - Adult Position

- General Gift Shop duties which include waiting on customers, using a cash register and credit card machine, balancing your drawer at the end of your shift and restocking the Gift Shop
- Proceeds from the Gift Shops are used to purchase items that benefit our patients and their family members.

Courtesy Cart Driver* - Adult Position

- Shuttle errand around the hospital campus (valid driver's license required)

Surgical Liaison* - Adult Position

- Liaison between patients' family members and staff
- Helps with restocking

Emergency* - Adult Position

- Liaison between patients and staff
- Assist with stocking rooms
- Assist in the transportation of discharged patients

Urgent Care* - Adult and Jr. Position

- Liaison between patients and staff
- Assist with stocking rooms
- Assist in the transportation of discharged patients

Patient Care at The Women's Center*

- Adult and Jr. Position

- Restocking
- Assist with patient requests
- Assist with discharges

Patient Care - Main Hospital* - Adult Position

- Assist with patient requests
- Restocking

Voices Program - Pre-med Students

- The purpose of the program is to visit with patients who need additional support
